


BACKSTAGE PASS

PW COMEDY OPENING IN FEBRUARY

Chase away the winter blues with Players Workshop's hilarious upcoming comedy *Sandy Toes and Salty Kisses* by Michael Parker and Susan Parker.

Described by one critic as ". . . fast-paced action, inventive physical comedy and crackling dialogue, *Sandy Toes & Salty Kisses* is an audience hit from start to finish . . .", the show opens at the Workshop at 1431 Grove St., Burlington, on Feb. 20, 2026, and runs for 2 weekends.

The story is set at The Lovers' Landing Beach Hotel, which is on a barrier island on the Gulf of Mexico.

The hotel is a popular wedding destination, which has acquired a certain mystique and which Audrina Brown has just inherited from her late father. That's when she discovers that her Uncle Bubba, the hotel manager, is running a variety of "extra-curricular activities," which, without exception, appear to be illegal, on the property! They run the gamut from cash-prize bingo to a rum distillery to off-track betting. You name it, Bubba is doing it! Into this situation come a New England blue blood and her daughter, who are checking things out for the daughter's wedding, and, well, everything quickly gets out of hand.

Appearing in the play are Anna Short of Burlington, as Audrina Brown, and Kevin Gobble of Wever as Wilberforce Brown, aka Uncle Bubba. Joni Ellison of Carthage plays Candy, the ditzy hotel receptionist; Jane Gobble of Wever is the "aristocratic" Beatrice Rutherford-Smythe; Fawn Orduno of Burlington plays her daughter Traci Rutherford-Smythe, who just wants to get married without all the hoopla; Todd Haeffner of Montrose is Douglas Dupont, a guest who is a victim of mistaken identity; and Ivan Orduno of Burlington is Peter Mudd, Traci's fiancée who keeps getting caught up in situations not of his own making.

PW veteran Libba Flores is directing, assisted by Joni Brainerd. Carol Hinkle is the producer.



Players Workshop is pleased to partner with Capitol Theater of Burlington to commemorate Black History Month by presenting a FREE, live production of Katori Hall's modern American classic *The Mountaintop*.

Set entirely in Room 306 of the Lorraine Motel in Memphis, TN, *The Mountaintop* is a “gripping reimagination” of Martin Luther King, Jr.’s, last night on earth.

In 1968, Martin Luther King, Jr., was in Memphis, to speak out on the behalf of the Memphis sanitation workers who had gone on strike after the deaths of two workers who had been crushed by a malfunctioning truck. The poor work conditions and pay the sanitation workers suffered angered the black community and encouraged them to speak out on behalf of other issues concerning civil rights

On April 3, 1968, the night before his assassination, King gave his speech, *I've Been to the Mountaintop*, where he declared, "We've got to give ourselves to this struggle until the end. Nothing would be more tragic than to stop at this point in Memphis. We've got to see it through."

After delivering the speech, an exhausted Dr. King returns to his room at the Lorraine Motel while a storm rages outside. When a mysterious stranger arrives with some surprising news, King is forced to confront his destiny and his legacy to his people.

Appearing in the production are Victor Walker and Njeri Patric. Kent Lewis of Players Workshop, assisted by Jim Beres, is directing the play, which is also being sponsored by the local chapter of NAACP.

American playwright Katori Hall is from Memphis, TN. In March 2010, after the British production of *The Mountaintop*, Hall became the first black woman in history to win the Olivier Award for Best New Play. The original Broadway production starred Samuel L. Jackson and Angela Bassett.

The Mountaintop will be presented at the Capitol Theater, 211 North 3rd St., Burlington, on Jan. 30 and 31, 2026, at 7:00 p.m. and on Feb. 1, 2026, at 2:00 p.m.


PW's participation was coordinated by PW's Anna Short, assisted by Nikki Critser. According to

DRACULA: A COMEDY OF TERRORS

Players Workshop will hold open auditions for its spring show—*Dracula: A Comedy of Terrors* by Gordon Greenberg and Steve Rosen—on Sunday and Monday, March 1-2, 2026, at 7:00 p.m., at the Workshop at 1431 Grove Street.

Dracula: A Comedy of Terrors is loosely (very loosely) based on the novel *Dracula* by Bram Stoker. “Ever wondered what would happen if you took Bram Stoker’s legendary vampire tale and put it into a blender with Mel Brooks, Monty Python, and *The 39 Steps*? That’s just what happens in this lightning-fast, laugh-out-loud gender-bending romp. When her sister Mina falls ill with a mysterious disease of the blood, Lucy Westfeldt and her fiance, Jonathan Harker, enlist the help of famed female vampire hunter Doctor Jean Van Helsing. Their hunt for the dangerous and sexy Count Dracula abounds in this bloodcurdlingly hilarious send-up to the literary classic.”

The directors are looking for 5-6 actors of any gender, but they **must** be aged 18 and older. Some actors will play more than one role, and there may also be gender-bending of some roles. For example, even though a role may be written as a female, a male actor could play it and vice versa.

Kara Ewinger is the director; she will be assisted by Adam Fauser. For more information, and for
